**BREAKING NEWS!!!!!!** As the Historian's gift for the New Year to our members, the History Book contest rules have been relaxed. You can use what I have on the website or from the bulletins but if you choose to be more creative without following the exact format, it will not count against you. The main thing we want is for your Unit to record your History with words, handwritten, typed or on a thumb drive along with some photographic evidence of what your Unit has accomplished throughout the year.

A good history should have a photo of your Unit President, it should have the Preamble, the Pledge and the prayer, how you structure it is up to your Unit Historian or whoever steps up to record and preserve your Unit History. Happy recording.

## TIPS FOR RECORDING YOUR HISTORY

- Keep a notepad handy so when memorable things happen you can jot them down. After an event, take 5 minutes to list key things accomplished.
- Your yearly event plan for your Unit can be a framework for your history book. For example, Children's Christmas party in December, visit Veterans Center in March, etc.
- After each event or function your Unit holds, record it then so when the time comes to submit the History book, all you have to do is to polish it rather than writing everything you did throughout the year in one day.
- Have everyone take and share their pictures with the Unit to make sure you record all the fun your Unit is having making a difference.
- Work with your Post to ensure you are included on the Legion Centennial site for Kentucky on your Post's history. (if you need assistance contact me).

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# January Poppy Bulletin

Happy New Year 2018! Be prepared to have some Poppy fun at the January Winter Conference.

To assist with reporting, here is a question to help create some of your Poppy end of year report: Did your Unit use the Poppy for Christmas for decorations or as handouts? If so, how?

Make sure to be thinking about a poppy display presentation for the Spring Conference.

As a reminder I have listed the contests below that will be judged in the Spring Conference and finally at the June Convention:

## Poppy Contests

### Judged at Spring Conference

#### Poppy Poster Contest - Department and National

Units shall sponsor contests in local schools. When schools do not conduct activities, other youth groups, including Junior members, may participate under direct supervision of the unit.

\*The contest shall have seven classes:

- Class I: Grades 2 and 3
- Class II: Grades 4 and 5
- Class III: Grades 6 and 7
- Class IV: Grades 8 and 9
- Class V: Grades 10 and 11
- Class VI: Grade 12
- Class VII: Students with special needs defined as:
  1. Those in special education classes
  2. A student recommended for special education classes but who has not been admitted due to a waiting list or various other factors.
  3. A child identified as having a disability, but not in a special education class due to lack of facilities. Identification contingent upon discretion of school officials.
- Poppy Poster Requirements:
  - i. Each poster shall have a fitting slogan not to exceed 10 words. Articles – “a,” “and,” “an,” “the” – are not to be counted as words. The words “buddy” and “buy” cannot be used.
  - ii. The words “**American Legion Auxiliary**” must be used in the design of the poster and will not be counted in the 10-word count.
  - iii. Each poster must include a picture of the **red Flanders Field poppy**.

- iv. The posters will be judged at Spring Conference in April, 2018. The poster shall be on 11x14" poster board. (Drawing paper will not be accepted).
- v. The United States flag may be used as long as there are no infractions of the flag code.
- vi. Posters will be judged using the following criteria:
  - 1. 50% - poster appeal (layout, message, originality)
  - 2. 40% - artistic ability (design and color)
  - 3. 10% - neatness
- vii. Media used shall be watercolors, crayons, powder or oil paint, handmade paper cutouts, ink or textures, acrylics, pencils and markers.
- viii. Written in ink on the back of the poster (not attached) shall be the class in which the entry is submitted, the name, address, age and grade of the contestant and the name of the department.
- ix. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians' grant non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.
- ix. The poster shall be the work of only one individual.
- x. The label "In Memoriam" from the veteran-made poppy may not be used.

### **Poppy Poster Contest Judging and Awards**

- 1. A citation from National will be given for the most outstanding poster in each classification within the five divisions.
- 2. A First, Second and Third place ribbon will be given from Department.
- 3. **All unit entries must be sent to the department chairman by April 15, 2018 if not judged at the Spring Conference.**
- 4. While ALA representatives will do their best to return all posters, it is not guaranteed. We recommend participants take a picture or scan their poster for their records.
- 5. Submissions become property of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through submission of artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant nonexclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted, and agree to have their names and artwork published for commercial use without additional compensation or permission.

### **Best Poppy Presentation Contest**

No tags, no netting or ribbons. The poppy must be the predominant theme for the display. One award given for both best Junior and Senior presentation. Be very creative. This can be wreaths, hats, or any presentation desired. Judging will be at Spring Conference.

## **Judged at June Convention**

**Unit Awards: Best Unit Poppy Chairman Award - Department**

**Type of Award:** Trophy/Certificate (1st/2nd Place) Judging at the June Convention.

**Presented to:** The top two Unit Poppy programs

National Award: - Citation to One unit chairman in each division (5) announced by the national Poppy committee at the pre-convention meeting.

### **Materials and Guidelines:**

- For the department program, entries should be a narrative that covers any relevant information involving program activity to include, facebook postings, pictures, significant events promoting the poppy and how promoting poppy use created awareness of our programs.
- If interested in submitting for National, follow guidelines below:

- Entries must include the award cover sheet located at the end of this program Plan.
- The entry must be typewritten in narrative format not to exceed 1,000 words.
- The report should cover all areas of emphasis and any relevant information involving program activity and describing your use of the poppy throughout the year.
- Send to Kim Ball by May 15th, 2018.
